MISSION REPORT

Novi Sad, 21.02.2011.

The meeting and e-services presentation of the contact person for activities 5.2. Ivan Gacesa in WP of the Student Union in Serbia, Natasa Sajlovic and Milos Lazic with students from University of Novi Sad, was held on February 21, 2011. at the University of Novi Sad, in Novi Sad, starting from 10:00. This meeting was organized for analysis of current usage of e-services among the student population and for coordinating purposes having in mind that the activities within the fifth work package of the SIGMUS project (WP5): Establishment and development of student services at Serbian Universities are in progress.

In the first part of the meeting, Natasa Sajlovic, Ivan Gacesa and Milos Lazic discussed some practical issues related to conducting a comprehensive analysis of the state of student e-services, based on the developed web platform. They agreed about including student's representatives, organisation and moderators on completing database for their faculties – information for subjects, professors, news and events.

In addition, they agreed that the student's representatives and organisations in their faculty should be asked to made their own reports/views about the student e-services and usage of web portal. With this aim, Ivan Gacesa will send instructions and open accounts for moderators and student's representatives for filling information to database of web portal.

Also, there were discussions about the organization of next visits and education of all students. How to fill in all information about subjects and events and how to represent all benefits of using e-services for education, sharing ideas and views on studying. Some conclusions have been made.

This meeting was very successful within the framework of Work Package 5.
